1. Students should act in keeping with the 7 School Values.

These are:

- 2. Be ready
- 3. Be proud
- 4. Be kind
- 5. Be courageous
- 6. Be positive
- 7. Be your best
- 2. Members of the School are accountable for their own actions (even when part of a group).
- 3. The following are forbidden and may lead to a student being asked to leave the School:
 - a) Breaking the law
 - b) The possession and/or use of unauthorised drugs (including medical, synthetic, vaping and illegal drugs and any associated paraphernalia) or offensive weapons or pornography
 - c) Unacceptable and inappropriate use of ICT (including social media)
 - d) Bringing the School's name into disrepute
 - e) Violent or disruptive behaviour
 - f) Repeated infringements of School Policies and Guidelines
 - g) Offences concerning the unauthorised possession and/or use of tobacco or alcohol
 - h) Vandalism
 - i) Bullying (including cyberbullying)
 - j) Stealing
 - k) Disruption of learning in lessons
 - I) Cheating in formal examinations
- 4. All students will:
 - Register in the morning and afternoon; attend lessons, meals, activities and fulfil other official School commitments
 - b) Present a clean and tidy appearance in accordance with the School's uniform guidelines

- 5. No students may leave the School grounds during the working day without prior notice and permission having been granted. In this instance students must sign out at Reception before leaving the site. After School, boarders must seek their House Parent's permission to leave the School site.
- 6. Students and parents should also be aware of the School's policies which are available to view on the School's website.

It is not possible to outline every possible infringement of rules in a list. It is expected that every student at Box Hill School is able to behave well and conform to standards of 'common sense'. The Headmaster will use his professional opinion to apply this metric where necessary.
